Classroom News

Reading: Students have begun learning our Daily 5 classroom routines. Soon we will begin our first unit, **Taking Charge of Our Reading**.

Homework

Second grade uses a **homework checklist.** Students will receive a homework checklist each week. Note that there are "Must-do" and optional homework assignments. Please be sure to review the checklist each week, as the assignments may occasionally change. Please sign the checklist and have your child return it to school every **Friday** or at the end of the school week. Students may choose how to complete each the assignment based on the given menu choices. Please keep this menu in a safe place at home. Please see the homework letter for more information about how students should complete their homework.

Grading

Throughout the week, your child will be bringing home many work samples in their Take Home Folders. Some of these assignments were completed in class and subsequently gone over in class as a whole group or in partners. Other assignments (both classwork and homework) will be "graded" by me. For these assignments, I use the following system:

A "**check mark**" means your child completed the assignment exactly as directed. This is the standard "grade" for most papers.

A "**check plus**" means that your child showed extra effort on the assignment. This could be a bonus, extra problems/ sentences/ examples, coloring, or other exceptional work that is above and beyond.

A "**check minus**" means that your child did not follow directions, did not complete the entire assignment, or did work that is not their best. They will <u>redo</u> the work.

*If your child receives a paper <u>without</u> any type of check mark, but with notes or corrections from me, please make sure that your child <u>fixes</u> any mistakes and turns the paper back in to me. I will then assign a "grade" and record that grade into my gradebook. If these assignments are not fixed and turned back in, your child will not get credit for that assignment.

What can you do at home to help?

- Create a comfortable homework environment for your child by setting a time, choosing a "go-to-spot" that is near you, creating enough space for your child to work, and finding and organizing supplies (pencils, erasers, sharpener, crayons, scissors, etc.). If you would like more suggestions, please feel to reach out!
- Increase *self-regulation* by helping your child check over their homework and to make sure they have all of their belongings needed for school.
